Jack Langdon Organ Concert 7:00 PM August 12th Langdon's approach to performance investigates the unique qualities of individual organs. Jack is a proponent of contemporary organ music and regularly creates new work. Jack lives in East Thetford on the unceded land of the Abenaki and is a member of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians. This program, Strafford Nocturne, features three works which encourage us to contemplate the quiet, beautiful moments of life, including a chorale prelude by Johann Gottfried Walther, and a work Langdon composed as a tribute to his time spent in and around Strafford featuring an intimate interplay between the sound of the organ and four field recordings taken at various locations in and around Strafford.
