Responsive Reading *adapted from Psalms 16*

Leader: Protect me, O God, for in you I take refuge.
You are my God. I have no good apart from you.

People: **Holy ones can still be found in the land
upholding the law of love.**
They are springs of delight in a desert.

Leader: Those who bow down before the false gods
of selfishness, greed and ambition
create suffering and sorrow in this world.
They sacrifice the blood of the earth
to their own gain.

People: **O God, you are my chosen portion,
I sacrifice all I have to your service.**
I place my life in your hands.

Leader: The boundary lines fall in pleasant places for me—
a goodly heritage in you and in all that is holy.

People: **You give me counsel, O God, and I thank you;
in the night my heart instructs me.**

Leader: I keep you always before me;
because you are at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

People: **Therefore my heart is glad,
and my soul rejoices;
my body also rests secure.**

All: **You show me the path of life.
In your presence there is fullness of joy;
in your right hand are pleasures forevermore.**

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery....For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself....”

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the selfish, materialistic ego. For what your selfish self desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the selfish self, and as a result you are internally divided, and it prevents you from doing completely what you want in either the material or spiritual realm. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not divided and can fulfill both the material and spiritual laws and goals. Now the works of the selfish ego are obvious: broken relationships, impure motivations, addictions, obsessions, resentments, conflicts, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, life out of balance, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things are blocked from the spiritual realm. By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy,

peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things in the material realm. And those who have the heart and mind of Christ have crucified the ego with its selfish passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.... so that whenever we have the opportunity, we will work for the good of all.

Luke 9:51-62

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; but they did not receive him, because his face was set toward Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village.

As they were going along the road, someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." To another he said, "Follow me." But he said, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." But Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."
