- *Agape*: compassionate, unconditional love for all, because loving actions are what the Spirit flowing through the heart and mind of Christ in us wants to do; and the direct result is
- *Koinonia*: the realm of God's beloved community forming around us as we do acts of love and justice, preserving, creating or restoring community, so earth may live as one...

Jesus offered this path as an urgently needed way out of trouble. Do you see ways in which this path could help your life, or help humanity in the social and environmental challenges on earth today?
