Mission Committee Update: Continuing Our Efforts to Help With California Wildfire Relief We continue to hold in our hearts our brothers and sisters who have suffered unimaginable loss in the California wildfires. On behalf of the church, we sent a donation last week to **World Central Kitchen** which is feeding victims of the fires as well as first responders. We heard that the **Altadena Community Church, UCC** burned, and sent them a donation with a note of support. The Open and Affirming Coalition of the UCC says: “Altadena became one of the first churches to declare itself Open and Affirming, welcoming all people, including those in the LGBTQ+ community, into the full life of the church. For decades, its mission has been to embrace diversity, foster peace, and serve neighbors in need.” We have sent a donation to the **national United Church of Christ**, as well. They are providing “immediate relief and... helping displaced families, churches, and communities rebuild their lives with care and.... an equitable approach to their long-term recovery.” We send our prayers to all who are impacted by the fires. Excerpts from Pastor Tom Kinder’s 1/14/25 Letter

My last Sunday will be January 26th and my last day of tying up loose ends will be January 31st.

As the Church Council wrote recently, they are working on a plan for the next stage, and until it is in place they will schedule “Seeking Spirit Sunday” speakers for February.

It feels good to be leaving the church in the hands of such extraordinary leadership—not only the Council but the Deacons and Mission Committee and everyone playing a role. We are a small village church blessed with a large pool of experienced, gifted and dedicated lay leaders.

There are ways in which the word “small” does not fit this church. We were full almost to capacity on Christmas Eve, our concerts are well attended, the building is full of activity almost every day of the year, and many generous people support our general, Deacons and Mission funds, enabling us to offer programs and support to people in need that expand our outreach far beyond our congregation’s size on a typical Sunday morning....

Thank you for these seven wonderful and eventful years! We have been through so much together, from the covid quarantine to becoming Open and Affirming to climate and anti-racism work to the election series to a steady stream of Mission actions to the community nurse and creative nursery to readings and book studies and Heartfulness meditations and children’s programs and profound times of reflection together on Sundays and extraordinary gifts of music and Deacon support of people in need, to mention only some of what we have experienced. What an amazing chapter in the life of this congregation!

Please know that after January 31st I will be thinking of you and this congregation often and sending love and light, and prayers that you flourish in the years ahead!
